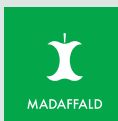


Sorting Guide



Food waste

Please tie a knot on the green bag.

Food scraps and bad food. Peels, eggshells and cores. Fish and chicken bones. Coffee grounds and filters. Tea leaves and paper tea bags. Cut flowers.



Plastics

Empty and scrape out packaging.

Rigid and flexible plastics. Plastic packaging from detergent, shampoo and food, with or without labels. Non-deposit plastic bottles. Plastic wrap and candy bags.



Food & beverage cartons

Empty and fold packaging.

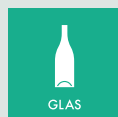
Cartons that have contained liquid food or drink, e.g. milk, cream, juice, cocoa, chickpeas, peeled tomatoes and yoghurt.



Paper

You may leave staples and tape on.

Clean and dry paper, e.g. magazines, newspapers, weeklies and envelopes – both with and without a window. Receipts and drawing paper.



Glass

Empty and scrape out the glass.

Wine bottles and other non-deposit glass bottles. Preserve jars and broken drinking glasses. Vitamin jars and spice jars.



Metal

Empty and scrape out packaging.

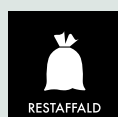
Tin cans, caps and metal lids. Pots, pans and cutlery. Tea light holders. Aluminium foil, foil trays and non-deposit cans.



Cardboard

You may leave staples and tape on.

Pizza boxes, corrugated cardboard and carton. Cardboard packaging from food, toothpaste and detergent. Tubes from kitchen and toilet rolls.



Residual waste

Everything you cannot sort into other waste types.

Napkins, kitchen roll, baking paper, vacuum cleaner bags, polystyrene and cigarette butts. Sanitary towels, cotton buds, cotton pads and scouring sponges.



Hazardous waste

Look for the hazard labels on the product.

Batteries, chemicals, paint and poison. Light bulbs, fluorescent lights and printer cartridges. All aerosol cans, e.g. deodorant, hairspray and dry shampoo. Dispose of hazardous waste in the hazardous waste cabinet or in the red hazardous waste box.



Textile waste

Put textile waste in a clear bag and tie a knot.

End-of-life clothing and textiles, e.g. clothes, towels and bedlinen. They may be worn, torn, stained or otherwise damaged, but they must be dry.



Small electronic items

Everything with a wire, battery or solar cell.

Phones, tablets, gaming consoles and chargers. Electronic toys, lamps, torches, wires, cables etc.



Large electronic appliances

Must be possible for two people to carry without lifting equipment. Place large electronics upright, without stacking it.

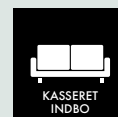
Domestic appliances, TVs, computer screens and vacuum cleaners.



Garden waste

Bundles must be no more than 120 cm long and 50 cm across.

Plants and plant parts, hedge trimmings, windfall fruit and smaller branches.



Bulky waste

Place bulky waste upright, without stacking it.

Furniture (other materials than wood), rugs, garden furniture, large iron and metal items, ironing boards, laundry baskets and mattresses.



Wood

Place the wood upright, without stacking it.

Furniture made of wood (only), boards, defective pallets and shelves.



Reuse and swapping

Drop off for swapping or reuse where you live, if you have such a scheme, at secondhand shops or containers around the city, or in the reuse area at Bispeengens Recycling Centre.
